The black male, approx 5’10”, clean shaved, medium build, then claimed the satchel as his own and demanded its return. We asked him to identify the contents of the bag and he simply held up the Street Sheet papers he was attempting to sell. We asked him to identify the contents of the zippered section of the bag he refused, becoming argumentative and belligerent. We advised that we could not confirm his ownership of the item without him telling us the contents of the zippered section at which time he tried to grab the bag from our possession, shaking it violently to try to release it from our teams grip, causing the contents of the zippered section to fall out and land on the ground. We immediately called the Patrol Special Police for assistance and Officer Taswell arrived within a few minutes. He spoke with our team and then the individual. It was established that the satchel did belong to the individual.

We urge restaurants, food delivery businesses and delivery persons to exercise caution when responding to calls.</p> <p>Food/Pizza Delivery Safety and Security Tips</p> <p>Suggested Tips for Businesses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop protocols for driver cash-handling and money transfer routines – establish limit for minimal amount of cash to be carried to make change. Drivers should carry no more than \$20.00 to make change (varies with business guidelines). • Call the police if you get a suspicious request, such as "Bring change for a \$100 bill" • Develop protocols for driver check-in with dispatch/home base • Businesses should identify service areas that may present an unreasonable risk of harm to employees making deliveries (no-go areas), and create policies and procedures designed to assess the degree of risk involved in making deliveries to a specific area • Develop protocols for reporting incidents – attacks, assaults, robbery, vehicle accidents, etc. • Businesses should consider contracting with cell phone companies that provide inexpensive units – phones should provide local service only with adequate coverage to the delivery area • Provide trainings to educate delivery drivers on best practices for safety and security <p>Suggested Tips for Drivers:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Never ignore their instinct or sixth sense – avoid being lured and/or ambushed, if possible • If possible, ride two persons to a car when delivering to questionable areas • Never wear or carry expensive personal items that may present a potential target – only carry those items necessary for the performance of the job (do not wear expensive jewelry or sunglasses and avoid carrying expensive cell phones, iPods' or anything that might be inviting) • Never park where vehicles can be blocked-in and keep vehicle

It can also be a time when strangers are in our neighborhoods as guests and visitors, and a time when we let down our guard a little and indulge a little too much. Some forethought and common sense can keep the holiday season fun, festive and safe for all.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Test your smoke alarms and replace the batteries if needed. If you have a carbon monoxide alarm, check it too. If you have a fire extinguisher, check and service or replace it if needed. • Keep the extinguisher, some damp cloths, oven mitts and pot lids handy when cooking those big family meals – just in case you need them quickly. Also, stay in the kitchen when cooking as most kitchen fires are the result of unattended cooking. • Decorate your home with flame-retardant or non-combustible materials and take extra care with festive lighting to ensure it is in good working order and open flame candles to ensure they are stable, cannot be easily knocked over, and are not within reach of children or pets. • If you are travelling to a holiday party, drink in moderation and either arrange for a designated driver, sober friends, public transportation or a taxi to get home afterwards. • Leave absolutely nothing of irreplaceable value in your vehicle when parking during the holiday season. Take presents and valuables home before continuing to shop. It only takes a minute or two for an opportunistic car thief to break a window, pop a trunk and clean out a glove compartment. • Let your neighbors know if you expect to be away for a few days, and if possible, have someone designated to drop in every day or so to check on things, pick up your mail and newspapers etc. Make sure they know how to get in touch with you if needed. • If you are travelling for the holiday, plan and pack early to avoid stressing and rushing on the day of travel. If you're driving, have your vehicle serviced or thoroughly checked a few days before you set off. Carry an "emergency kit" just in case the worst happens and you are stranded for a couple of hours or more.

- If you take advantage of the holiday sales, take only the credit cards and cash you will need for the shopping trip. Stay alert to your surroundings and who is around you. Don't overload yourself with packages. Try to stay on well travelled and busier streets and areas.
