The Castro Community will remember the incredible service, friendship and loyalty of Patrol Special Police Officer, Jane Warner who passed away one year ago on **Sunday May 8, 2011 at noon** in the plaza re-named in her honor, **Jane Warner Plaza** on the corner of 17th Street and Castro Street.

Officer Warner, or just Jane as she was so well known by many in the community, lost her battle with Ovarian Cancer on May 8, 2010 but is remembered by thousands and was honored by the Police Commission and the City of San Francisco with the re-naming of the plaza. The remembrance celebration will begin at noon with a blessing by the Sisters of Perpetual Indulgence and a few speeches by friends and colleagues of Officer Warner.

Funds are still being raised to install a permanent plaque in the plaza to memorialize Jane and the incredible service she provided to the Castro, Noe Valley and Mission neighborhoods for over a decade. If you would like to donate at the remembrance service, you will be able to do so.

This remembrance service comes just days before the official **National Police Week** events, May 15th through May 21st. Take a moment to say hi to an officer and thank them for their service. Since 1962 when President Kennedy first proclaimed National Peace Officers Memorial Day, National Police Week activities have brought special attention to the service and sacrifice of those in law enforcement.

162 officers were killed in the line of duty in 2010.
15,000 relatives were impacted by those officers lost in 2010.
19,202 officers have been lost in the line of duty since 1791.
