<p>COALITION FORMS TO INCREASE HATE CRIME REPORTING AND REDUCE HATE VIOLENCE</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">BREAK THE SILENCE STOP THE VIOLENCE</p> <div style="text-align: center;"> </div> <p>Working together as an entire community is the best and most effective way to combat crime in general, and to address specific concerns in particular. A concerted effort has begun to take shape through a coalition of governmental and non-governmental groups to address one particular area of considerable concern for everyone throughout San Francisco – that of Hate Crime reporting and Hate Crime Violence.</p>

Many of the organizations above have been working to combat such crimes and under-reporting for years. The new coalition of organizations will work to leverage the strengths of each towards a common purpose and message in the fight to increase reporting and reduce hate crime violence throughout the city.

The Federal Bureau of Investigations, the San Francisco District Attorney's LGBT Forum and the San Francisco Police Department Chief's LGBT Community Advisory Forum will form the governmental side of the coalition, which a number of well established and respected NGO's will form the public side.

The first steps of the coalition will be to develop and deploy a public information campaign to encourage every person in San Francisco to report hate crimes. Reporting is known to be lower than the level of actual crime occurring for many well known reasons. The coalition and information campaign will address many of these reasons and offer reassurance, support and in some cases alternatives that will allow vital information to be gathered.

Another aim of the campaign will be to reduce the number of hate crimes committed by bringing the problem to the consciousness of the general public and emphasizing the fact that San Francisco will not tolerate such hate crimes and will prosecute them to the fullest extent possible.

It is early days, but such cooperation, collaboration and mutually beneficial efforts are a gigantic step in the right direction. Kudo's to the FBI, District Attorney Gascon and SFPD Chief Suhr for their commitment and drive toward this goal. Stay tuned and we'll definitely let you know much more as the coalition grows and the public information campaign gets underway.

CHILD-ID APP**

A CHILD GOES MISSING EVERY 40 SECONDS IN AMERICA. SADLY MANY NEVER RETURN HOME. THIS NEW F.B.I. APP MAY JUST HELP!



You're shopping at the mall with your children when one of them suddenly disappears. A quick search of the nearby area is unsuccessful. What do you do?

Now there's a free new tool from the FBI that can help.

The just launched Child ID app—the first mobile application created by the FBI—provides a convenient place to electronically store photos and vital information about your children so that it's literally right at hand if you need it. You can show the pictures and provide physical identifiers such as height and weight to security or police officers on the spot. Using a special tab on the app, you can also quickly and easily e-mail the information to authorities

with a few clicks.

The app also includes tips on keeping children safe as well as specific guidance on what to do in those first few crucial hours after a child goes missing.

Right now, the Child ID app is only available for use on iPhones and can only be downloaded for free from the App Store on iTunes, but we plan to expand this tool to other types of mobile devices in the near future. And we'll be adding new features—including the ability to upload other photos stored on your smart phone—in the coming weeks and months.

We encourage you to share the word about this app with family and friends, especially during upcoming activities in your communities to raise awareness on crime and drug prevention.

For its part, the FBI is working to publicize the app with the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA)—its long-time partner in the National Child Identification Program, which provides a physical kit to gather your child's pictures, fingerprints, personal characteristics, and even DNA to keep with you in case of emergency. The AFCA is producing a public service announcement about the app and will spread the word at various football games during the upcoming season.
