**\* ALWAYS** maximize your personal safety; plan & prepare for safety before leaving your home. \*

- Limit your valuables (ID and money) by carrying only what you need for the day. Carry money & valuables close to the front of your body and conceal them under your clothing. Do not carry your wallet in your back pocket.
- Protect your laptop computers from theft by transporting them in a nondescript bag.
- When on the street, be ALERT and AWARE at all times. Make good eye contact with the people around you. Walk with confidence and purpose.
- A handbag or book bag with a strap should not be worn across the body. It should be carried under the arm and released if grabbed. This will prevent your body from being pulled to the ground in an assault.
- Have your cell phone easily accessible to you in case you need to call 911 . Keep your cell phone fully charged at all times.
- Let another person know of your itinerary for the day and your expected time of return.
- There is safety in numbers. Walk with others in well traveled, well lit streets. Do not take short-cuts through parking lots or alley ways especially at night.
- Get to know the stores/public buildings that are along your walking routes. Build allies in the community where you live and work. You never know when you might need to call on them.
- Digital music players are a huge target of thieves and robbers. Try not to use them in public. Wearing headphones and ear buds distracts you from potential danger and makes you an easy target.
- If taking public transportation, have your money or Fast Pass ready. Do not fumble with your wallet.
- ATM transactions should be made inside a store or at one that is well lit and visible. Shield the keypad while you input your code. Do not count or display your money. Put your money away immediately. Take your receipt & your ATM card with you.
- Trust your instincts. If you feel uncomfortable, seek help immediately. Carry a whistle to call attention to yourself when you need assistance.
- Protect your vehicle from theft. Always lock your doors and glove compartment. Never leave valuables (GPS system, laptop, cell phone, digital music player, coins, CD's, clothing, wallet, etc.) unattended in the car.
- When using your laptop in a public place (ie; Coffee Shop, cafe), do not sit by the door. Sit inside with your back against the wall, facing the door.
