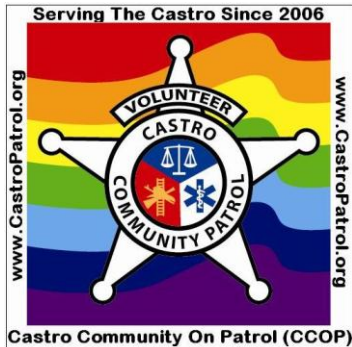

There is strength in numbers and much can be achieved when a few good people work together.

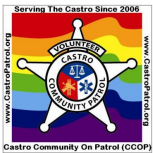
BUSINESS WATCH is the commercial partner to the residential **NEIGHORHOOD WATCH** program. Establishing an effective **Castro Business Watch (CBW)** program is relatively simple, but the benefits of being involved are tremendous. **Castro Community on Patrol (CCOP)** is proud to work with our fiscal sponsor **Safety Awareness For Everyone (SAFE)** in helping to get the CBW

program rolling. We hosted the first orientation meeting in February and will host at least one more formal orientation meeting to formally launch the CBW as an official city watch program.

Six businesses attended our first CBW meeting and are eager to participate. We anticipate a number of additional businesses throughout the Castro and Duboce Triangle area who were unable to attend the first meeting, will attend the second orientation and sign up to participate. CCOP and SAFE will have experts on hand and each orientation meeting to describe the business watch concept in detail, to provide guidance and advice on how to set up, participate in, and how to sustain the CBW into the future.

Participation in the CBW is FREE, entirely voluntary, and offers a number of significant advantages to business owners in the area including free training and information from SAFE on various aspects of safety and security training for owners and staff members alike. In order to formally establish the CBW, participants must elect a "captain", develop a communications tree, and provide a map showing the locations of participants to SAFE. Our plan is to accomplish these three requirements within the next month and to request formal recognition of the Castro Business Watch by the City as soon as possible. Once established, businesses can join or withdraw from the CBW at will – though we anticipate the benefits of the program will encourage long term participation and involvement.
