## HELP THE SFPD AS A VOLUNTEER DURING DISASTERS

### **JOIN THE SFPD A.L.E.R.T. PROGRAM** **Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team** **Thursday November 15, 7PM** **SFPD Academy, 350 Amber Drive, Room 100**



The San Francisco Police Department has developed a volunteer citizen disaster preparedness program. The Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (ALERT) will recruit, train, credential, and uniform volunteers to assist law enforcement in the event of a natural or manmade disaster. Volunteers must be at least 16 years of age and live, work, or attend high school in San Francisco.

The ALERT program is modeled after and works in partnership with the San Francisco Fire Department's Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT). The ALERT program will train members of the public to assist law enforcement in essential tasks after a major disaster.

Such tasks may include:

- traffic control,
- foot patrol of business and residential areas,
- reporting criminal activity,
- working in partnership with NERT volunteers to provide well-being checks,
- assisting with emergency aid and first aid situations,
- working at district police stations,
- working with Animal Care and Control in the handling of pets and strays,
- securing resource locations,
- delivering logistical supplies,
- direct individuals to mass casualty and shelter locations,
- assist at reunification centers, provide support at schools for reunification,
- participating in Operation Return.



Volunteers will receive training from both the San Francisco Fire Department and the San Francisco Police Department. ALERT volunteers will first complete the Fire Department's Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) training ([www.sfgov.org/sfnert](http://www.sfgov.org/sfnert)), and then graduate into an eight hour Police Department course specifically designed for ALERT team members.

The ALERT program will have Basic, Senior, and Supervisory level positions. Based upon the volunteer's level of additional training, he/she may wish to obtain Senior or Supervisory level status.

All ALERT volunteers will be subject to a basic background check given to all Police Department volunteers. After the completion of training and having met any and all requirements, the ALERT volunteer will be given identifying credentials reflecting their level of training and role within the ALERT program.

### **What is the profile of an ALERT member?**

Someone who:

- Is at least 16 years of age and lives, works, or attends high school in San Francisco.
- Recognizes the need for community involvement in law enforcement tasks and has the time to commit and provide assistance.
- Wants to be of value and service to the larger community, especially during times of disaster.
- Has a particular interest in law enforcement, the maintenance of law and order, and who wishes to connect and work with members of the San Francisco Police Department.
- Has an interest in building community preparedness to respond to and recover from major events and disasters, and may possess skills or work experiences which include emergency repairs and construction.
- Has good communication skills, a balanced approach to stressful situations, and may be willing to take on the role of supporting the Police Department when necessary.
- Is willing to participate in training and maintaining skills.

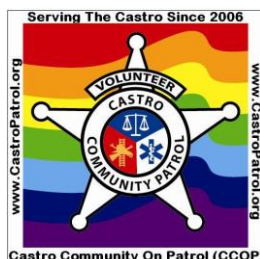

## IMPORTANT SAFETY TIPS FOR CLUBS & BARS

### PLEASE BE CAUTIOUS AND FOLLOW THESE DATING / HOOK-UP SAFETY TIPS

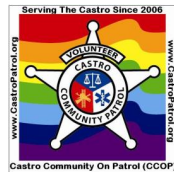


The San Francisco District Attorney, **George Gascon**; the Chief of the San Francisco Police Department, **Greg Suhr**; the Chair of Castro Community On Patrol, **Greg Carey**; the Chief of Community Patrol USA, **Ken Craig**; and the lead STV Sisters, **Sr. Eve Volution & Sr. Pat n Leather** urge everyone to be cautious and take some extra safety steps when meeting new people for dates or immediate hook-up's.

- **DON'T** accept drinks from strangers unless you receive it directly from the bar staff.
- **DON'T** leave your drink unattended in a bar, club or other public location. Take it with you or if you do leave it for a time, buy yourself a new drink to avoid being drugged without your knowledge.
- **SNAP A PICTURE** - of anyone you meet for the first time, and e-mail it to yourself or a trusted friend. Include the name and phone number of the person if you have it.
- **BE A BUDDY** – establish a buddy system with a trusted friend if you go home with someone you just met. Arrange to call or text them when you get there safely and do the same when you leave or the next day. Include the address and apartment number if you can. Do this for your own friends also.
- **STAY ALERT** – watch your friends and those around you, not in a creepy or paranoid way, but look out for each other and if you see anything suspicious or unusual, report it to bar staff, security staff, door staff or if you think it's needed – to police on the non-emergency 3-1-1 or emergency 9-1-1 numbers.
- **DON'T GET WASTED** - if you go out to get wasted with friends, ensure those friends will get you home safe and sound. **DON'T** pick up a stranger when your wasted, and don't get wasted if you intend to go home with a stranger. You increase your risk tenfold by doing so.

- **TRUST YOUR INSTINCTS** – If your instincts are telling you something isn't quite right, or things are just WAY toooooo good to be true, TRUST THEM. It's better to miss something that may be pretty good occasionally, than to end up in a really horrible or life threatening situation that you may not walk away from.
- **REPORT** anyone who steals from you, assaults you, or abuses you in any way during a date or hook up. You may have gotten away relatively unharmed, but their next victim may not be so lucky. Your report could SAVE A LIFE.
- **SAFE REPORTING** – police can treat your report confidentially. If you feel uncomfortable reporting to police directly, contact Castro Patrol or Stop The Violence and we'll help or pass the information on for you while maintaining your anonymity.

## COMMUNITY PARTNER REPORTING



If for ANY reason you don't feel comfortable reporting a crime to police, you can contact any of these COMMUNITY PARTNER REPORTING organizations who work closely with the LGBT community and the law enforcement community.

They can pass on information to appropriate law enforcement sources anonymously on your behalf, advise you on whom to contact and how, provide guidance on whether something is important enough to report (though the DA and SFPD Chief always say EVERYTHING is worth reporting – let police decide how important or relevant it may be), and may be able to accompany you or provide a supportive volunteer if you elect to make a formal report.

Your report could save the next person from suffering the same victimization, or it could save their life!
