Then without warning another WFA ran up and attempted to pull the suspect away from us. The Security personnel then pulled the other WFA away from me so that I could handcuff the suspect. Then the crowd of onlookers who were protesting the suspects arrest approached me as if they were going to assist the suspect while she was still fighting with me. I then contacted the Communication Center and put out an emergency call for assistance. While I was still attempting to get the suspect handcuffed she was able to get her left hand free and strike one of the Security personnel with a closed fist. Moments later, several regular SFPD Officers arrived to assist me. The suspect was then successfully placed in handcuffs and placed in the rear of the patrol car. The other WFA suspect was also arrested, but issued a citation and released a short time later. The other suspect was charged with (Assault and Battery) with the intent to cause grave bodily injury. She was then transported to the Mission District Police Station for processing.

2. Once you start your NERT training, you'll have the information you need to help you develop your own family safety plan and your emergency resources. Simply add one or two extra items you typically buy to your shopping list each week/month and you'll have disaster supplies ready in no time, with little extra effort.
3. When you graduate from the NERT training (which involves a fun practical last class with fire extinguishers and cribbing), you can consider supplementing your existing knowledge through the other disaster response organizations:
  - a) San Francisco Disaster Preparedness Coalition for Animals, Disaster Animals Response Team (**DART**) which will assist in establishing and running animal shelters adjacent to human shelters in the event of a major disaster. DART will help prevent the many problems that were widely publicized post Katrina in New Orleans. [CLICK HERE](#) for the current schedule of DART classes.
  - b) San Francisco Police Department, Auxiliary Law Enforcement Response Team (**ALERT**) will assist the police department in various ways during a disaster, such as traffic control, supplies security, foot patrol in certain areas, paperwork etc. [CLICK HERE](#) for the current schedule of ALERT classes.

### AVOIDING ROOFIED DRINKS

- **DON'T** accept drinks from strangers unless you receive it directly from the bar staff.
- **DON'T** leave your drink unattended in a bar, club or other public location. Take it with you or if you do leave it for a time, buy yourself a new drink to avoid being drugged without your knowledge.
- **IF YOU FEEL UNUSUALLY UNWELL** after only one or two drinks, let the bar/club staff or your friends know and go to a safe and secure area immediately. Consider seeking medical attention if warranted.

### DATING / HOOKUP SAFETY



- **SNAP A PICTURE** - of anyone you meet for the first time, and e-mail it to yourself or a trusted friend. Include the name and phone number of the person if you have it.
- **BE A BUDDY** – establish a buddy system with a trusted friend if you go home with someone you just met. Arrange to call or text them when you get there safely and do the same when you leave or the next day. Include the address and apartment number if you can. Do this for your own friends also.
- **STAY ALERT** – watch your friends and those around you, not in a creepy or paranoid way, but look out for each other and if you see anything suspicious or unusual, report it to bar staff, security staff, door staff or if you think it's needed – to police on the non-emergency 415-553-0123 or emergency 9-1-1 numbers.
- **DON'T GET WASTED** - if you go out to get wasted with friends, ensure those friends will get you home safe and sound. DON'T pick up a stranger when your wasted, and don't get wasted if you intend to go home with a stranger. You increase your risk tenfold by doing so.

### **REPORT ALL CRIMES & SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY TO SOMEONE**

- **TRUST YOUR INSTINCTS** – If your instincts are telling you something isn't quite right, or things are just WAY too good to be true, TRUST THEM. It's better to miss something that may be pretty good occasionally, than to end up in a really horrible or life threatening situation that you may not walk away from.
- **REPORT** anyone who steals from you, assaults you, or abuses you in any way during a date or hook up. You may have gotten away relatively unharmed, but their next victim may not be so lucky. Your report could SAVE A LIFE.
- **SAFE REPORTING** – police can treat your report confidentially. If you feel uncomfortable reporting to police directly, contact Castro Patrol or Stop The Violence and we'll help or pass the information on for you while maintaining your anonymity.

Working together as a community, we can protect ourselves and our friends, we can keep the Castro a fun and safe place to live, work and play; and we can help to identify those who choose to target the Castro and ensure they are apprehended and brought to justice.
