<b>AUTO BOOST / STRIP CRIMES</b>	<b>HIGH INCIDENCE OF AUTO BOOST/STRIP CRIMES IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD</b>



The theft of items from parked vehicles (reported in this document as an Auto Boost/Strip) has always been a part of this and many other neighborhoods, as it is often a crime that can be committed quickly with little experience required by the criminal.

Some simple security steps can help you, your family and friends avoid unnecessary losses, though nothing can truly guarantee you will never experience a "smash & grab" type vehicle break-in.

- NEVER leave anything of value in your vehicle, whether in view or secured in the trunk or glove compartment. If it's not there, it cannot be stolen if a theft occurs.
- Remove all items from the passenger compartment. Even old sweaters, empty CD cases, and loose change in center consoles can encourage a criminal to break a window.
- Always try to park in well lit, well travelled areas whenever possible. This will reduce your risk, but not eliminate it entirely.
- If you are the victim of this type of crime, report it as soon as possible. You can do so on-line at the SFPD web site. Such reports can help build up a pattern of activity with what is often a few criminals who cause a crime spree. Your report may help net them.
- If you return to your vehicle and see someone breaking into it, Call 9-1-1 immediately. Get a detailed description of the suspect to provide to police when they arrive if the suspect has left by that time. Your safety is more important than your property, so be very careful until police are on scene.
- Don't presume your vehicle is safe and secure when parked in a condominium or public parking lot, even when cameras and security is on patrol. Follow the above recommendations even when parking in secured parking lots.
- Press charges. If police secure a suspect, pressing charges will help to keep such individuals off the streets for a while.

### **South Beach C.O.P.S.**

The South Beach Community On Patrol Service (SB-COPS) initiative is a non-profit group of unpaid volunteers who live, work, or play in the community and donate their time to walk, bicycle or drive in regular citizen safety patrols as an extra set of "eyes and ears" for law enforcement.

SB-COPS volunteers undergo a three hour training class and then join a volunteer patroller pool. You are notified of SB-COPS shifts by e-mail and can sign up to help our for part, or all of the shift time needed. SB-COPS provide a visible safety presence and also provide information, advice and act as ambassadors for the neighborhood. Any persons 18 years or older is eligible. SB-COPS do not break up fights or arrest people.
