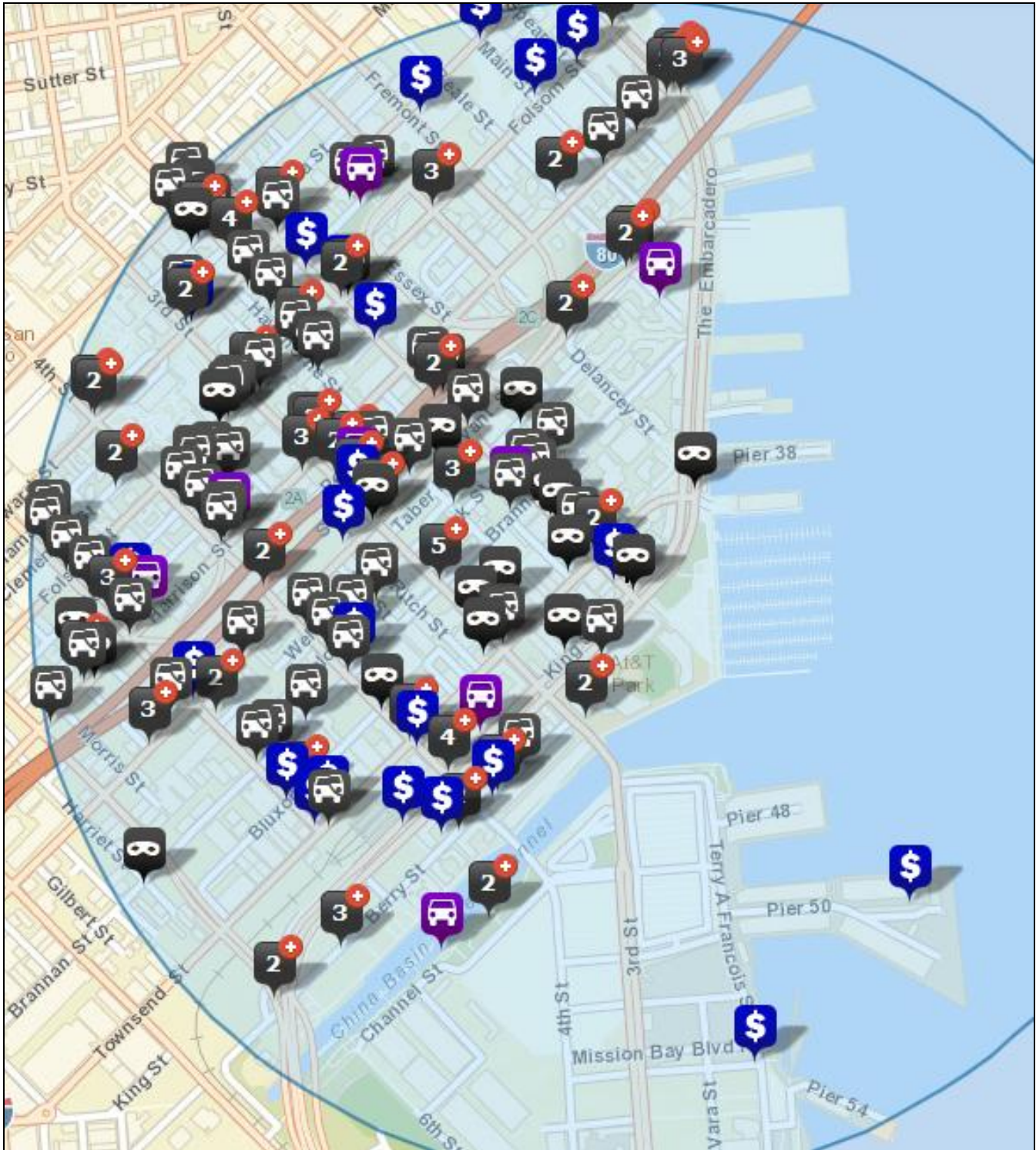
**LEVEL 2 (ASSAULT / BATTERY / ROBBERY) LOCATIONS**
